

Catch the Kardashians

TO celebrate new episodes of *Keeping Up with The Kardashians*, E! Entertainment (DStv channel 124) will be open to DStv Compact customers this weekend.

Viewers can watch a weekend marathon of the series, culminating in the exclusive premiere of a new episode from the second part of season nine tomorrow at 9 pm. This season sees Kim preparing for her big day. She proves that big dreams really do come true when she and Kanye grace the cover of fashion magazine *Vogue*, and show off their baby girl on its pages.

Over on BBC World News (DStv channel 400), Andrew Graham-Dixon hosts *The High Art of the Low Countries*, at 5.10 pm today and 11.10 am and 11.10 pm tomorrow, in which he reveals just how important Holland and Belgium were in the birth of oil painting in the late Medieval period, the triumph of the Dutch golden age, and the onset of polarising modern-art movements surrealism and abstraction.
