

# Found out who is in 'Idols SA'

TOMORROW the South African public will find out who will be vying for their votes during the historic 10th season of *Idols SA*.

After weeks of trials, tribulations and heart-pumping moments — first at the auditions around the country and then at the hellish theatre week — the top 31 contestants will be facing the judges one by one in Sun City's Superbowl to meet their fate.

KwaZulu-Natalians will be hoping that Vincent Bones (29), who has already endeared himself to viewers with his story of going from former street kid to a worship leader, Chloë Clark (25), Kyle Deutchmann (26), Malibongwe Zulu (20) and qualified doctor Lihle Buthelezi (25), will all get the green light from the judges.

*Idols South Africa* season 10 is a co-production between M-Net and Mzansi Magic. Catch all the action at 5.30 pm on channel 101 and channel 161.

Over on e.tv, viewers can watch *Rolling with ... Harrison Crump* at 6.30 pm tomorrow. The house-music maestro has been producing since the early nineties, and his long list of credits can be found on labels such as Dust Traxx and Subliminal Records. In South Africa, Harrison makes music and collaborates with the local industry's best. This year, he collaborated with HHP, Omar and Asher to launch the hit track *So Amazing*.

On *Rolling with ...* viewers will see a new perspective of South Africa through his American eyes and will get a glimpse of his lifestyle, his family and friends.

SABC3 will be showcasing Frene Ginwala, the first female speaker in Parliament, in this week's *21 Icons* at 8.27 pm tomorrow night.
