Tonight 21 Icons features "ability activist" Michaela "Chaeli" Mycroft.

At 16, Mycroft won the 2011 International Children's Peace Prize, and the following year the Nobel Peace Laureates' Medal for Activism. She received the awards for her commitment to the rights of children with disabilities in South Africa through her project, the Chaeli Campaign.

Earlier this year she became the first woman quadriplegic to summit Mount Kilimanjaro.

The 21 Icons show has been tracing South Africa's history, moving from the fight for freedom to the country's growth during democracy, and concluding with a vision of the future.

The show celebrates individuals who inspire multitudes through their impact, integrity and influence.

Mycroft is seeking to create a global community that accepts and embraces disabilities.

"A lot of people refer to me as a disability activist, but I don't see myself that way. I focus on the ability. I concentrate on potential and empower people to see their own greatness."

Mycroft was diagnosed at 11 months with cerebral palsy.


insightful and inspiring, exploring her journey from 2004 when, aged 9, she and her sister and three friends teamed up to raise R20 000 for a motorised wheelchair.
